

# CONCLAVE 2021: LAST MINUTE DETAILS

# Things to consider if you are headed for Big Bear


As you gear up to head out to Conclave in Big Bear, here are some things you might want to keep in mind.

#### Weather and Altitude

Big Bear generally has good weather in May, but it is an Alpine area, so it can really cool off at night. Average highs for mid-May are about 70 degrees, with lows around 40. Great driving weather for our hot little Healeys during the day, but you will want warm clothing for the evenings. Average rainfall for the month is only one day, but it is not unknown to even get a little snow. So be prepared for a bit of anything.

Also, keep in mind that Big Bear is at an altitude of 6,752 feet (with some drives over higher passes) so the UV levels can be elevated even if the temperature is on the cool side. Bring that sunscreen and a hat.

Some events, like the Santa Maria BBQ will be held poolside, so be prepared. Currently, we hope to hold most of the major events (cocktail parties, banquet, etc.) inside, but our



COVID "Plan B" is to move those outdoors if restrictions preclude large indoor gatherings.

#### Spares and Repairs

The year-round population in Big Bear and surrounding areas is about 20,000, but many Southern Californians maintain vacation homes in the area and visitors' number in the hundreds of thousands. Therefore, the area is well served, not only with restaurants and shops, but also with the essentials of daily life.

Gas stations are plentiful. There are two auto parts stores and several repair shops. Towing is available from two companies (but you won't need it)! There are a handful of full-sized grocery and drug stores. Big Bear is served by a regional hospital with a 24-hour emergency room.

Of more specific interest, Moss Motors will be providing a "chase van" for the driving events that will be stocked with common Healey repair parts, and overnight service is available for items not on hand. And as Conclave veterans know, there is no shortage of parts (and advice) from Healey owners. At least four full-time Healey technicians will be in attendance.

#### Getting the Healey Ready

Needless to say, you will be planning to have your Healey in top condition before setting off for Big Bear. Pay particular attention to cooling and brakes. Your arrival and our drives will take you up some long and steep grades (and down the other side), so you will want to avoid cooling and braking issues.

Fortunately, our SU carburetors are designed so that ...continued on page 3

adjustment for altitude is usually not necessary. The air is thin, so you might run a little rich, but probably not enough to require turning any screws.

#### On Your Way In

There are four main routes into Big Bear. If you are coming from the Northwest, the South or the Southwest (I-10) you will have three choices. From west to east, they are Highway 18, Highway 330, and Highway 38. A suggestion would be to try 330, as our driving tours will take you on 18 and 38 later in the week. All routes are roughly the same

distance and drive time.

If you are coming from the Northeast (I-15), you can take Highway 138 from the Cajon Junction and then Highway 18 to Big Bear. Alternatively, you could cut off in Victorville and take Highway 18 all the way.

There is really no reason to "stock up" before heading up the mountain as supplies and gas in Big Bear are plentiful and not expensive (by California standards).

#### Other Considerations

 If you have a National Park pass, bring it along. You will get into Joshua Tree National Park for free.

- Please bring your club banners.
   About half the rooms have balconies facing the parking lot. We would love to have the whole face of the hotel covered with Healey banners.
- Don't forget your Theme Night attire: <u>California Cowboy</u>, 50's/60's, Wearable <u>Art</u>, and Beach Party.
- And remember your Arts and Crafts and Photo Competition entries.
- If you are in the Gymkhana, try to bring a helmet as we will have limited loaners and all helmets need to be 2005 or newer.
- Finally, take lots of photos on your way to Big Bear. We will have an Online Photo Contest.



The purpose of the Tool Box is to assemble, and make available for use by STAHC members, specialty tools that are used in the restoration and/or maintenance of Healeys. In general, such tools will be those that are too expensive for an individual member to acquire for one time, or infrequent use.

- Lift-the-Dot Hand Punch. (Punches center hole and prong holes for installation of Lift-the-Dot fasteners for tops and tonneau covers. Moss Motors No. 226-105.)
- Texas Fastening Tool
- Snap Fastening tool
- Valve Guide Reamer size .281 for intake and exhaust standard size valve guides used on all Sprite and Midget A series engines 1958 - 1974
- Engine leveler (for removing or installing an engine)
- Carb Synchronizer
- Colourtune Carb Synchronizer
- Wire Wheel Spoke tool
- 1/8" OD pipe bending tool
- Panel & Trim Removal Tool Set
- CD Workshop Manuel for Sprite MK 2, 3 & 4.
